The 2Gethers Foundation is a nonprofit (501c3) organization. The organization was founded in January 2018 by Dr. Tiffany M. Gethers and David A. Gethers, on the strong belief that every student deserves a chance to go to college. Reflections from their personal experiences as firstgeneration students, they founded an organization dedicated to improving access to higher education, student success, and retention rates particularly among at risk student populations.

The organization's specific purpose is to address barriers that firstgeneration students face so that they can successfully persist through higher education and successfully attain a college degree. Students are classified as first-generation if they are the first in their families to attend college or if neither of their parent(s) or guardian(s) have obtained a bachelor's degree.

The 2Gethers Foundation provides a number of programs and services to address students' barriers and to

enhance first-generation students' academic, social, and career development such as:

- Scholarships to graduating firstgeneration high school seniors
- Mentorship program
- Free workshops and seminars on various topics for students and parents
- Pop-up food pantries on college campuses.

Impact

Since our inception in January 2018, we have served nearly 3,000 students through our Gateway 2 College and College success programs in the form of scholarships, snack pack giveaways, mentorship and leadership development. We are so grateful to all of our donors, volunteers and community partners.

College Success. From February-May, 2021, we welcomed the first cohort of our pilot Defy the Odds Mentoring & Leadership Development. We had seven mentees to participate and
